All members of the school staff have received specific training from an accredited Prevent trainer.

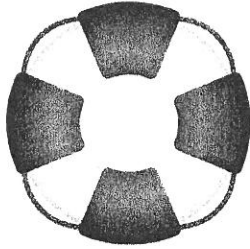
Children are encouraged to explore ideas of community, belonging and tolerance during PSHE lessons.

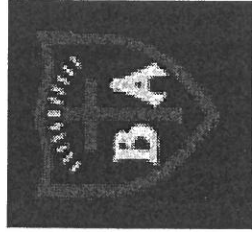
