Illness

The season of bugs is upon us! To prevent sickness/diarrhoea being spread across the school, your child **must** be kept away from school until 48 hours after the last bout. Children are often unsettled and miss important instructions or learning if they are late. Classrooms are open from 8.45am and it is expected that all children are in class for 8.55am for the register. Thank you for your help with this.
